### **THE PLAN OF ACTION INVOLVED**

- Mentoring of students and faculty.
- Tobacco free campus, illiterate computer campus, litters free campus and ragging free campus.
- Interdepartmental seminars.
- Broadband connection, free library internet services and Wi-Fi zone.
- To bring alumni back into the campus and build relationship with them.
- Personal counseling of students.
- Continuation of the previous year celebration of the college and annual report of the college is published every year.
- Engage proactively with students, faculty and staffs to learn from our multiple perspectives provide academic support and advance career preparation.

### **PLANNED AND EXECUTED**

- Mentor programs were made formal and institutionalized.
- Mentoring of students: Students were divided into groups and allotted faculty. Members who mentor the group primarily on academic issues.
- Personal counseling of students by professional counselor appointed by the college.
- Ragging free campus: Ragging is strictly prohibited in our college. In order to avoid any incident arising by ragging; anti ragging committee has been jointly clubbed with the discipline committee of the college.
- Cleaning of the college campus from time to time to provide clean and litter free campus.
- Broadband connection has been made and the college provides free Wi-Fi to all the students and faculty of the college.

### **Activities of IQAC 2018-2021:-**

#### **1. Red Ribbon Club -**

The Red Ribbon Club is a voluntary on-campus intervention program for students in educational institutions. Red Ribbon Club was established in Jubilee Memorial College on the 20<sup>th</sup> of September 2017. It is initiated and supported by the Nagaland State AIDS Control Society (NSACS). It is a movement started by the Government of India in schools and colleges through which, students spread awareness over HIV / AIDS. RRC envisages to instill charity mind among all the students to extend their able help towards developing healthy life styles, donating blood to all the needy by promotion of Regular voluntary blood donation. Presently, JMC has 71 RRC registered members.

#### **Aims:**

The RRC aims at harnessing the potential of the youth by equipping them with correct information on HIV/AIDS Prevention, Care, Support and Treatment. It also aims in building their capacities as peer educators in spreading messages on positive health behavior in an enabling environment and increasing voluntary blood donation from among youth.

#### **Objectives:**

1. To reduce new HIV infection among youth by raising their risk perception through awareness on HIV & AIDS.
2. To induce among youth the spirit to help and support people living with HIV/AIDS (PLHA) thereby reducing stigma and discrimination against PLHAs.
3. To motivate youth and build their capacity as peer educators and change agents by developing their skills on leadership, negotiation and team building.
4. To harness the potential of the youth by equipping them with correct information on HIV/AIDS prevention, Care and Support and Treatment.
5. To build their capacities as peer educators in spreading messages on positive health behavior in an enabling environment.

## **Activities of RRC 2017- 2021:-**

1. In commemoration of the 'International Youth Day' (13<sup>th</sup> August 2018), a poster competition was organized on the theme '*Prevention is better than cure, especially when there is no cure*'. B.A 5<sup>th</sup> Semester was adjudged as the winner while B.A 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester Sec B secured the second position.
2. On account of World AIDS Day, a blood testing drive for HIV/AIDS was conducted at Jubilee Memorial College on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2018 in collaboration with DAPCU and Care and Support Society. Altogether 97 students and faculty members came forward for HIV testing.
3. Red Ribbon Club erected Hoardings on HIV /AIDS Awareness in and around the College Campus on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2019.
4. In commemoration of the 'International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking' (26<sup>th</sup> June 2019), an Essay competition was organized on the theme '*Health for Justice, Justice for Health*'. Rishienla Longchar of B.A 6<sup>th</sup> Semester was adjudged as the winner while Lanubenla Walling of B.A 4<sup>th</sup> Semester secured the second position.
5. RRC, JMC organized a Tobacco Awareness Programme in Collaboration with the Department of Sociology on 17<sup>th</sup> July 2019. Dr. Funit Longchar was the Resource Person of the day and he highlighted on Tobacco and Oral Health, ill effects of tobacco use etc.
6. Eight students represented Red Ribbon Club, Jubilee Memorial College in the District Level Online Quiz Competition on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of November 2020 and Ms. Lanubenla Walling from 5<sup>th</sup> Semester bagged the 3<sup>rd</sup> Position under Mokokchung District.
7. Red Ribbon Club organized an online Slogan Competition in commemoration of World AIDS Day 2020 (1<sup>st</sup> of December 2020) based on the theme 'Ending the HIV/AIDS Epidemic: Resilience and Impact'. Altogether there were 22 entries out of which Ms. Noktila 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester B emerged the winner, Ms. Imonenla 5<sup>th</sup> Semester B as the 1<sup>st</sup> Runners up and Ms. Samalemla was placed as the 2<sup>nd</sup> Runners up.
8. An Awareness programme on HIV/AIDS was conducted on the 20<sup>th</sup> of March 2021. Sanitizer, handwash and masks were distributed to the students, faculty and staff of Jubilee Memorial College by the Red Ribbon Club Members.

## **2. NSS -**

NSS Unit, Jubilee Memorial College was awarded a formal affiliation as Self-Financing Unit (SFU) in September 2017, by the Government of Nagaland, Directorate of Youth and sports NSS Cell, Kohima. Since then, it has embarked its journey in helping the students in acquiring leadership qualities and democratic attitude. It has provided diversified opportunities to students in the college to develop their personality through community service. NSS is beneficial to both students and the society as well. It has helped the students to grow individually and also as a group. It makes the students confident, developed leadership skills and gain knowledge about different people from different walks of life. The programme aims to instill the idea of social welfare in students and to provide service to

society without bias. NSS volunteers works to ensure that everyone who is needy gets help enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity.

- 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2018: NSS volunteers undertook community service under “Swaachhta Ki Seva” programme by conducting cleanliness drive from Rotary building till New Market Junction, Mokokchung.
- 10<sup>th</sup> October, 2018: NSS Unit participated in Walkathon organized by department of Health and Family Welfare under the theme “Young People and Mental Health in the Changing World”.
- 15<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup> January, 2019: JMC, Unit hosted Inter-District Youth Parliament Festival, sponsored by Nehru Yuva Kendra, Mokokchung. The 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Position was bagged by NSS, JMC Unit. The winner represented the District in the State Youth Parliament Festival at Kohima.
- 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2019: Organized National Day in the college by conducting Extempore Speech Competition. This event is sponsored by Nehru Yuva Kendra, Mokokchung.
- 5<sup>th</sup> July, 2019: In collaboration with Nehru Yuva Kendra, Mokokchung, NSS volunteers celebrated World Environment Day by organizing Seminar on the theme

'Beat Air Pollution', Tree plantation drive was conducted in the college campus along with placing of waste box at five strategic locations in and around the campus.
