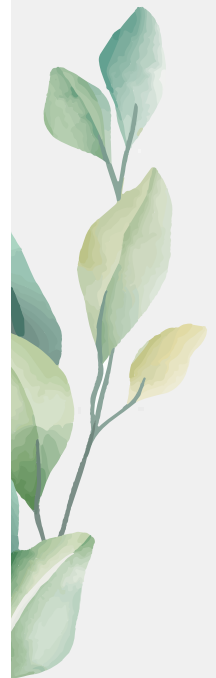

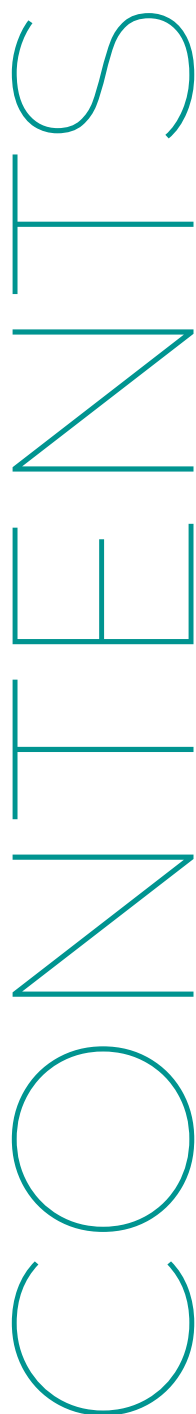

Jubilee Memorial College offers the curriculum under NEP 2020 approved by Nagaland University. This gives students the academic freedom to pursue the subjects and courses of their choice and aids their mobility to different institutions levels of learning. The undergraduate degree offered is the Bachelor of Arts with Major, with various exit options within this time frame, as per UGC norms.

Major and Minor Disciplines

The major discipline is the subject of the main focus, and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits through core courses in the major discipline.

Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an English major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in History, then the student will be awarded a B.A. degree with a Major in English and a Minor in History.

Students are advised to choose a Minor discipline from other relevant subjects in such a way that their study of their core major discipline would be enriched by the knowledge they obtain from their minor discipline.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Economics

The B.A. in Economics programme comprehensively introduces the forces that shape the world, covering money, markets, people, and policies. The curriculum begins with foundational concepts and builds up to deeper, more advanced topics influencing everyday economic life, such as why prices rise, how governments make decisions, how jobs are created, business decisions and how the market operates, etc. Emphasis is placed on helping students understand economic ideas and theories clearly and connect them to real-life situations. The programme incorporates statistical and mathematical tools to explore real-world issues like income distribution, development trends, population changes, and saving and investment habits. To support academic success, the Department provides catch-up courses aimed at strengthening foundational knowledge. These sessions are designed to enhance core skills such as problem solving, time management, accuracy, analytical thinking and logical reasoning.

Upon completion, graduates are equipped with both theoretical knowledge and practical skills, preparing them for diverse career opportunities in fields such as business, finance, public policy, development studies and beyond.

English

The BA English programme aims to develop students' critical, analytical, and communicative abilities through the systematic study of literature across diverse periods, genres, and cultural contexts. It seeks to equip learners with skills in close reading, interpretation, and argumentation, enabling them to engage meaningfully with literary texts and their socio-historical, political, and cultural dimensions.

The programme introduces students to a broad range of literary traditions, including classical, British, American, Indian, and postcolonial literatures, along with key concepts in literary theory and criticism. It also emphasises the development of academic writing, research skills, and effective oral communication.

In addition, the course fosters intellectual curiosity, ethical awareness, and sensitivity to issues of language, identity, and representation, while encouraging independent thinking and informed perspectives. It prepares students for higher education, research, and diverse professional pathways, while promoting responsible engagement with society.

Environmental Studies

The Environmental Science programme aims to develop a comprehensive understanding of the Earth, ecosystems, and environmental processes, along with the complex interactions between natural systems and human activities. It seeks to equip students with foundational knowledge in areas such as ecology, climate change, biodiversity, pollution, resource management, and environmental policy.

The programme emphasises scientific inquiry, analytical thinking, and practical skills, enabling students to assess environmental problems and propose sustainable solutions. It also introduces interdisciplinary perspectives, integrating physical, biological, and social sciences to address contemporary environmental challenges.

Further, the course fosters environmental awareness, ethical responsibility, and a commitment to sustainability, preparing students for higher studies, research, and careers in environmental management, policy, and related fields.

History

The B.A. History Programme enables students to demonstrate a broad knowledge of historical events, periods, and significance. It also provides fundamental knowledge in the discipline of History and its study of the History of India and the World. The programme intends to provide an extensive survey of early Indian History to the students and familiarise them with the tools for studying ancient Indian History.

The course will equip the students with adequate expertise to analyse the further development of Indian culture till the Harappan civilisation, the process of other cultural development and regional variations. The course also seeks to develop a historical understanding of the major developments in some parts of the Ancient and Medieval world. Another focus of the course is on the transition from feudalism to capitalism in Europe. The course shall critically examine economic and political power dynamics within Europe and its contact with the New World. Students will be introduced to the concept of Eurocentrism in our understanding of the rise of the modern West.

The Department of History will engage the students in Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) with Introduction to Archaeology, which is designed to provide value-based and skill-based knowledge. It will engage the student in archaeological research and theoretical study spanning pre-colonial to contemporary times and prehistoric archaeology, and lay emphasis on the importance of theory and analytical concepts in reconstructing the region's past. It aims to disseminate the knowledge of the past to society in ways that will change ideas and further inculcate new thinking for a more sustainable future within a rapidly changing society.

Political Science

The B.A. in Political Science programme introduces students to political theory, its history, and approaches. It acquaints them with the constitutional designs of state studies and institutions and their workings. It will also familiarise the students with basic concepts and approaches to studying the comparative politics of developed and developing countries. Besides, it will also attempt to provide the students with a comprehensive understanding of contemporary administrative departments.

A key objective of the course is to make students aware of the implicit Eurocentrism of International Relations by highlighting particular, specific perspectives from the Global South. It also offers insights into key contemporary global issues, such as the Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, Ecological issues, International Terrorism and Human Security, before concluding with a debate on the phenomenon of global governance. The course also takes the students back to Greek, Indian and Modern antiquity. It familiarises students with the manner in which the political questions were first posed by introducing them to a wide span of thinkers and themes.

Psychology

The Undergraduate Programme in Psychology aims to develop a comprehensive understanding of human behaviour and mental processes through scientific, theoretical, and applied perspectives. It seeks to equip students with foundational knowledge across core areas such as cognition, development, social behaviour, personality, and psychological disorders, while introducing biological and socio-cultural influences on behaviour.

The programme emphasises the development of critical thinking, research skills, and statistical competence, enabling students to design, analyse, and interpret psychological studies. It also integrates practical training through experiments, psychological testing, fieldwork, and applied learning in areas such as counselling, organisational behaviour, and community psychology.

Further, the course fosters self-awareness, emotional intelligence, and ethical responsibility, while preparing students to apply psychological principles in real-life contexts. It aims to prepare learners for higher studies, research, and professional roles in mental health, education, organisational settings, and community development.

Sociology

The mandate of the B.A. Sociology course is to introduce students to a sociological way of thinking. Sociology is the most contemporary and versatile of all Social Sciences. It trains students to grasp social structures, understand social processes, map the dynamics of social change, decipher social interactions and make sense of individual and collective experiences in their social, historical and cultural contexts. The course also gives a general introduction to sociological research methodologies, which will provide the student with elementary knowledge of the complexities and philosophical underpinnings of research. It emphasises formulating research design, methods of data collection, and data analysis. It will provide students with elementary knowledge on how to conduct both quantitative and qualitative research.

The implementation of NEP 2020 enables the students to opt for different inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary, and skill-based courses that suit their interests. In addition, to the major and minor cores, the department also offers Skill Enhancement Course on topics like “Techniques of Ethnographic Film Making” and “Reading, Writing and Reasoning for Sociology”.

The full range of papers provided in all the courses gives a thorough overview of the subject matter that they choose to master. Additionally, the optional papers give autonomy to the students to exercise their own choice in the matter. Overall, the syllabi is oriented towards giving an advantageous leap to the students who engage in the curriculum provided.

SUMMER INTERNSHIPS



The College promotes structured internship opportunities to bridge academic learning with real-world experience. As part of its commitment to skill-based education, Jubilee Memorial College facilitates summer internships that enable students to apply classroom knowledge in practical settings and gain exposure to professional environments.

Students undertake internships in areas such as media, education, community organisations, and cultural institutions, helping them develop essential skills, confidence, and clarity in their academic and career pathways.

Across the College, departments facilitate discipline-specific internship opportunities, ensuring relevant and meaningful experiential learning aligned with students' fields of study.

Aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, internships form an integral part of the College's focus on experiential and outcome-based learning.

Evaluation System

- Total: 100 marks
 - a. Internal Assessments: 25 marks
(comprising the best 2 out of 3 tests of 11 marks each)
 - b. Attendance: 3 marks are reserved for attendance
- The minimum qualification for appearing in the end-semester examination will be a 40 % score in the internal assessment. Additionally, the class attendance should be a minimum of 75 % of the classes conducted.
- Leave of any kind, including a medical certificate, will not be entertained for exam-related matters.

Admission will be conducted on a first-come, first-served basis, ensuring an equitable process for all applicants.

Note:

1. Admission fees can be paid either in one instalment during admission or in two instalments.

- 1st instalment ₹ 5,000/- + Uniform fee in May
- 2nd instalment ₹ 3870/- in June.

2. Tuition fees will be paid monthly, with a late fine of Rs 50 after the 15th of each month

3. Uniform fee may increase depending on the size of the garment/student

4. Some relaxation in uniform fees is given if a sibling has studied in the College earlier.

RULES & REGULATIONS

In order to ensure an efficient system that adheres to proper guidelines and order, Jubilee Memorial College demands the utmost respect and discipline from the individuals who seek admittance. The students are expected to strictly adhere to all the instructions and policies issued by the college authority.

The following mandates should be maintained properly with the greatest prudence:

1. The fee payment deadline is set for the 15th of each month, with a late fine of ₹ 50 applicable for defaulters.
2. Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes. A student whose attendance is below 75% in any semester may be asked to discontinue their studies in college or barred from appearing in the End-of-Semester Examination.
3. College property must be handled with utmost care. In case of damage, the student is liable to compensate monetarily for the said damage.
4. Students are required to behave in a disciplined and dignified manner within and outside the College premises. Abusive behaviour or acts of indiscipline will not be tolerated, and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken by the college authority against the guilty party.
5. Students must conduct themselves with politeness, respect and regard for their peers, faculty and staff members.
6. The use of tobacco or smoking, consumption of alcohol/drugs/any other intoxicating substance is strictly prohibited for students. The College has the right to search/test and confiscate any such substances. Any student found to be in possession of or under the influence of such substances is liable to expulsion without prior warning.
7. Students are required to adhere to the dress code/uniform as prescribed by the college. The designated Discipline Committee will provide the details of the dress code and penalise those who do not conform to the guidelines.

8. Students are not allowed to join/form any association/organisation/union within and outside the college premises apart from the ones specifically created or permitted by the College authority.

9. Participation/involvement of students in any form of agitation/subversive activities/demonstration which is prejudicial to the interest of the college is strictly prohibited.

10. Without prior written approval by the concerned authorities, any kind of celebration, gathering or meeting within the College is not allowed.

11. Students are not allowed to raise any funds from students/teachers/staff without the written approval of the authority.

12. Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited. Any student indulging in/encouraging/abetting such activities, whether actively or passively, will be expelled immediately. The college has an Anti-Ragging Cell to monitor such activities. Students are also required to fill out the Anti-Ragging Affidavit at the time of admission.

13. Students are required to abide by all the rules and regulations stated by the College. Defaulters will be liable for disciplinary action as decided by the College authority.

14. In case of any matter that is not covered under these mandates, the decision of the College authority shall be final and binding for all concerned.

15. The interpretation of the content of these mandates by the College authority is final and binding for all concerned.

The College has established these fifteen mandates, which are expected to be strictly followed. The content is subject to change under the direction of the college authority.

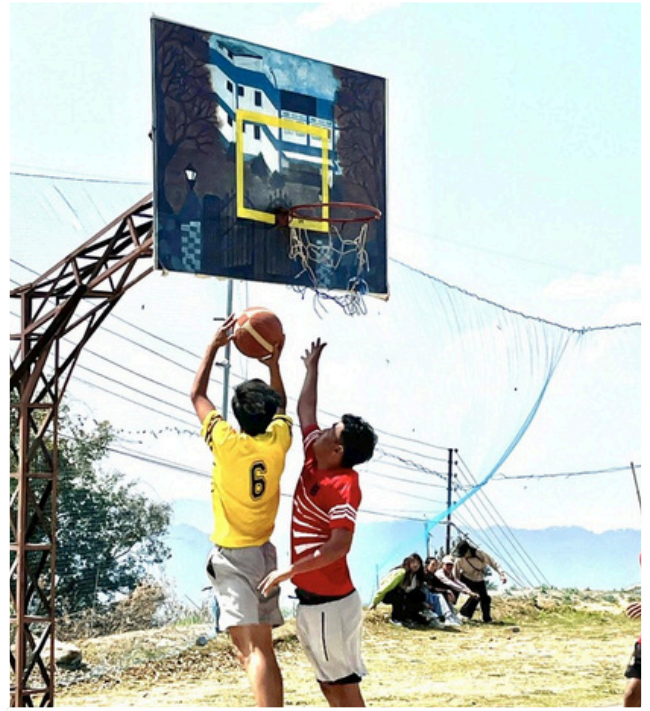

Library

Computer Library

Access to printing and automatic generator backup for the entire College is available; which powers the usage of the computers as well.



College Canteen

Conveniently located within close proximity of the main building, the college offers a reasonably priced menu for students and staff. The operating hours of the canteen are from 9:00 am in the morning until the close of working hours in the college.



Smart Classrooms

The experience of learning can be enhanced by engaging the teacher and student dynamics with visual tools that are beneficial to the system. The College has a qualified counsellor who offers guidance in a confidential and supportive environment. Through regular and need-based sessions, students may seek assistance for academic, personal, and emotional concerns, enabling them to manage challenges and maintain overall well-being.

Criteria for the Students' Welfare Fund Programme

Financial assistance will be available for students with disabilities and financial needs or deserving students of Jubilee Memorial College in accordance with the following criteria:

Eligibility

- Financial aid for supporting the education of students belonging to economically weaker sections.
- Financial aid for students with disabilities and needy students of Jubilee Memorial College.
- For any other reason, the Student Welfare Fund Committee may consider fit.

Selection

- Applicants need to apply by filling out the Student Welfare Programme form.
- Applicants will be called for an interview by the Student Welfare Fund Committee.
- The decision of the Principal and the Student's Welfare Committee will be binding and final.

General Guidelines

- If the applicant defaults in attendance or internal assessment, the financial assistance shall be stopped immediately.
- In case the applicant is found to have furnished false particulars/information, the financial assistance shall be stopped immediately.
- Misuse of the aid will render the student liable to severe disciplinary action.
- Students who are re-applying should have sound academic and attendance records.

The college provides this programme for those qualifying these criteria.
